The Dean reports directly to the Senior Vice Chancellor for Academic Affairs at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln, and is the chief academic and administrative officer of the College of Engineering. The Dean is responsible for directing this multi-campus college with a statewide responsibility for engineering education by defining and implementing a powerful strategic vision, providing leadership in guiding efforts to identify meaningful goals and initiatives as part of the larger institution, and simultaneously developing a distinctive identity for the College. Candidates should have an outstanding academic record, an abiding commitment to excellence in professional education and research, the ability to collaborate effectively with a broad range of constituencies, and the skill to develop a purposeful and compelling strategy that will distinguish the College of Engineering as a relevant and valuable regional, national and international resource.

The University of Nebraska–Lincoln, chartered in 1869, is a member of the Association of American Universities and also serves as Nebraska’s land grant institution. UNL is classified by the Carnegie Foundation for the Advancement of Teaching as an RU/VH institution, is a major research university with a wide array of grant-funded projects aimed at broadening knowledge in the sciences and humanities and is one of the nation's leading teaching institutions. UNL becomes a member of the Big Ten athletic conference and the Committee on Institutional Cooperation in July 2011.
